Summary

Our flower-focussed week in south-western Bulgaria took us to some remarkable botanical locations and we found a huge range of plants, some familiar to UK botanists, but many of them Balkan endemics. Midsummer is a good time to visit this region as the mountain roads and passes are mostly clear of snow and the alpine flora is at its best. We were able to get to some high-altitude sites, many of them above the tree-line, where typical alpine flowers were showing well, but some of them at the edge of rapidly melting snow patches. We had many interesting walks through forests, where the flora, plus the birds and insects, were of great interest and there were plenty of opportunities for the photographers to get close views. Travelling in our small bus through the unspoilt countryside gave us the chance to see the type of agriculture still practiced here; White Storks were easy to spot with their nests being seen on the rooftops in many of the villages, and we often saw them in the large open fields. There was time to visit the famous Rila Monastery, a world heritage site, and to explore some of the quiet villages and admire their very productive gardens. Even some of the "waste ground" sites in the more developed areas provided us with plenty of plants and insects to study.

Day 1

Saturday 17th June

We were on the morning BA flight from Gatwick which arrived in Sofia in the early afternoon, and the party assembled at the airport. Vlado and our driver met us and we transferred to the comfortable modern bus. Once we had negotiated the traffic and roadworks in Sofia, we headed south towards the Studena Lodge, near the village of Dragichevo, which was to be our base for the next two days. The torrential rain which greeted us on arrival had not cleared by the time we were on the road, so we headed out of the city and did not make any stops on the way. We eventually reached the Studena Lodge and checked in and there was then time for a stroll down the lane to check out our surroundings. The sun came out for us and we enjoyed looking at one of the most striking plants of the roadsides in Bulgaria which we were to see almost everywhere; the Hungarian or Showy Mullein Verbascum speciosum is a large branched mullein which thrives along the roadsides. Amongst the flora on the verge here we found good numbers of insects, including many Black-veined White butterflies, drying themselves off under thistle flower heads after a rainy day. Snatches of the song of a Nightingale could be heard from the dense shrubs nearby.

We met up again in the impressive dining room, the walls lined with hunting trophies, for our evening meal, and Andrew and Vlado explained the procedure for the next few days. The view of the distant wooded hills was very impressive, with mist rising from the valley. Large numbers of House Martins and Swallows, many of which were nesting under the eaves of the building, were feeding over the grounds of the lodge. We all enjoyed a good night's sleep in these peaceful surroundings.

Day 2

Sunday 18th June

We awoke the sound of rain falling, but we dressed for the weather, and after breakfast took a short drive towards Golo Bardo mountain, passing through some small villages with well-tended and richly planted gardens. A pair of White Storks was spotted on a roof-top nest and small chicks could be seen peeping over the edge. For our first full day we had a good introduction to the Balkan flora, with its many endemics, and we made rather

slow progress, finding plenty of species to interest us. The beautiful golden species of Kidney Vetch *Anthyllis aurea* was very photogenic, despite the rainy weather, but there were plenty of other endemics and very local species here as well.

We moved to a more sheltered woodland area for our picnic, and on a steep roadside bank found some lovely Red Helleborines *Cephalanthera rubra*, in full flower; this was just one of the many rare British native species we were to encounter during the week.

Our final stop for the day was at a riverside site where we explored the rocks and shingle and the mixed flora included a number of upland species which had been washed down from high altitude by storms. The small but striking foxglove *Digitalis lanata* was quite common here, and the slender *Micromeria cristata* was found flowering on the roadside rocks. The rain persisted but we had time for another look around the grounds at the Studena Lodge where Wall Germander *Teucrium chamaedrys* was flowering on the top of the wall by the lodge. The weather had not been suitable for butterflies to be on the wing, but we did see the Black-veined Whites again, mostly sheltering from the rain and the Nightingale serenaded us from the scrub.

Day 3

Monday 19th June

We packed up and left the Studena lodge this morning, and were pleased to see that the weather had improved. Our first stop was at another site on the Golo Bardo mountain where more endemic plants were to be found. The richly-coloured and splendidly named *Centuarea imanuelis-loweii* was in full flower here, at one of its few sites in Bulgaria, and we also found a fine stand of Balkan Lizard Orchids *Himatoglossum jankae* and at least three species of Yarrow (*Achillea*) relatives, including one hybrid, which proved to be rather confusing.

It was tempting to stay longer and go on exploring this rich habitat but we moved on, passing through the small town of Kocherinova where there were more occupied nests of White Storks on the chimney pots. We glimpsed the many vegetable plots, all very carefully tended, with a good range of fruits and vegetables, vines and flowering shrubs. From here the road led steeply upwards towards the very famous Rila Monastery, but we stopped on the way at a traditional mountain restaurant for lunch, which was enjoyed by all. It became rather cloudy and humid as we climbed the mountain road, with the deciduous woodland eventually giving way to slopes of pines and spruce. There was light rain falling when we reached the monastery, and there were already crowds of visitors there before us, but we had time to explore this very famous site and visit the magnificent Orthodox Church at its centre.

We drove back down the road to a marshy meadow, and as the weather had improved we were able to follow a trail through the tall sedges, finding Marsh Helleborines *Epipactis palustris* in full flower. The Lax-flowered Orchids *Anacamptis palustris* subsp. *elegans* were almost all over, but a few spikes still had some recognisable flowers on them; we could see that they would have looked splendid a week or so earlier. This meadow had a few other species of interest in it, including Spiny Rest-harrow *Ononis spinosa* and the Common Hedge-hyssop *Gratiola officinalis*. The Common Blue butterfly was quite numerous here.

We drove on towards the large town of Bansko, a mostly modern development, built up as a ski resort around an historic village. Our modern hotel was in the centre of the town, but around it were a few vacant plots which had a very rich flora growing in them. We enjoyed our evening meal of traditional Bulgarian cuisine in the dining

room fitted out in the style of a mountain lodge, and afterwards went through our lists and the plans for the next few days.

Day 4

Tuesday 20th June

We woke to sunshine and blue skies which was ideal for the visit to the lower slopes of the Pirin mountain, part of the large Pirin National Park created in the 1930s. Despite all the recent development for winter sports, vast areas of the park have been left untouched and we were impressed by the pristine state of much of the habitat we explored. We drove up the zig-zag road through the forest and then left the bus at the Banderitsa Lodge and walked up the mountain road, exploring the verges on either side. There was so much to see and we made the typical slow progress of botanists, but it was a fairly easy habitat to explore and our list of new flowers for the trip grew rapidly. Above our heads the forest was made up mostly of coniferous species, including some splendid Bosnian Pines *Pinus heldreichei*, and one very old and very large specimen was a notable feature of the walk. This tree is known as the Baikusheva Mura and is thought to be 1,300 years old. Birds noted on this walk included Nutcracker, Sombre Tit and Crossbill, but for most of the time we were looking down at the rich flora. There was plenty of colour in the ground flora, with species like Rock Cranesbill *Geranium macrotrhizum* flowering well in large spreading clumps. Other less conspicuous species included One-flowered Wintergreen *Moneses uniflora* and the tiny Olive-leaved Daphne *Daphne oleoides*, and in rock crevices we found Holly Fern and Brittle Bladderfern. More patches of colour were provided by Yellow Flax *Linum capitatum* and the Fox-and-cubs relative *Pilosella guthnikiana*.

We reached a spot where the road crossed a snow-filled gulley with a rushing mountain stream, and had our picnic here with superb views of the mountains and forests all around. After this we explored the margins of the snow patch, finding crocus flowers *Crocus veluchensis* just starting to open, and on the grassy margins there were some clumps of Cowslips *Primula veris* in full bloom. It was only a relatively gentle walk along the road to the Vikren Alpine Lodge where the road ended. We had a short break here before we started on the descent, by way of a stony track which crossed a few streams and wet flushes; special plants found here included Frivald's Fragrant Orchid *Gymndadenia frivaldii*, and the intensely purple Heart-flowered Marsh Orchid *Dactylorhiza cordigera*. There were some good track-side specimens of Moonwort *Botrychium lunaria*, a rather elusive small fern which is easily overlooked. As we followed the path down we crossed the snow gulley at a lower level and more alpine species, which must have been washed down from the higher slopes, were found here including Woolly Androsace *Androsace villosa* and Balkan Butterwort *Pinguicula balcanica*. The path led us down to the starting point of our walk at the Banderitsa Lodge where we rejoined the bus to return to Bansko.

After a very full day we met up again for dinner and then had plenty of time to go over our lists and discuss the next day's plans.

Day 5

Wednesday 21st June

The weather looked good again, with blue skies and a gentle breeze. We took the same mountain road, but this time we drove straight to the Vikren Lodge and set off on the well-marked mountain trail. Our starting point was 1,972 metres above sea level, and the mountains towering around us rose up much higher than this. The path was steep in places, but clearly marked and there was plenty to see as we climbed up. We passed through the last of the trees which were mostly Dwarf Mountain Pine *Pinus mugo* before the valley opened out into a beautiful

grassy valley with a clear river running through it. Bird's-eye Primrose *Primula farinosa* and Pyrenean Gentian *Gentiana pyrenaica* were found here and where there were still a few snow patches the Dwarf Snowbell *Soldanella pusilla* was flowering. We climbed up to a large tarn, known locally as Okoto, or the "Eye Lake", which had patches of Quillwort growing in the margins, and on the rocks around it Swiss Clubmoss *Selaginella helvetica* was spotted. Another rare British native species was found nearby in the form of Purple Coltsfoot *Homogyne alpina*, growing out of a carpet of Oak Fern *Gymnocarpium dryopteris*. The Balkan endemic Alpine Bellflower *Campanula alpina orbelica* was also noted as we descended the trail. We were lucky to spot a beautiful male Ring Ouzel collecting food on the steep slopes and taking it to the nest at the base of small tree.

We returned to the lodge and had our picnic on their terrace before returning to the bus. After the lunch break we drove back down the road and across one of the newly-created ski-slopes with its snow-making jets hanging over it, to an isolated outcrop of what appeared to be a conglomerate rock, a favourite haunt of rock-climbers. This proved to be quite a productive area botanically with a few new species growing conveniently at eye level. The dry pine wood here had some small flowering specimens of Red Helleborine, and growing alongside were two more species of Wintergreen in the form of Nodding Wintergreen *Orthilia secunda* and Pale-green Wintergreen *Pyrola chlorantha*. Another roadside stop here enabled us to find soem familiar British species in the form of Herb-Paris *Paris quadrifolia*, Twayblade *Neottia ovata* and Bird's-nest Orchids *Neottia nidus-avis*. A large patch of orchids at the roadside turned out to be Wedge-lipped Orchids *Dactylorhiza saccifera*.

Day 6

Thursday 22nd June

We checked out of the hotel after breakfast but there was time to explore one of the undeveloped plots nearby where there was a very colourful flora. The mullein plants towered over us and we added some more species to our list, including the shrubby Erect Clematis *Clematis recta* and Crown Vetch *Securigera varia*. An elderly couple were seen cutting certain plants and loading them on to a wheelbarrow; when asked by Vlado it turned out that they were collecting certain choice herbs for their goats. They had seen the town of Bansko grow out all recognition in their lifetime. The numbers of butterflies and other insects foraging in these plots was quite impressive and we added Spanish Sparrow and Pallid Swift to our bird list here. There was time for a relaxing coffee break in the pleasant town centre of Bansko and we visited the ancient church in the historic centre. Storks were nesting on top of the tower, and uncountable numbers of Swifts were feeding overhead.

We left the Pirin National Park behind us as we headed south towards Dospat, close to the border with Greece. There was attractive scenery all around and very little traffic. The road followed a river for a while and in the meadows alongside it there were Storks feeding. We stopped for lunch at the Satovcha picnic site, where the local people had provided a covered area, with seats and a barbecue and had even left table cloths. There were flower-filled meadows all around with Golden Orioles calling and more White Storks feeding in the fields. This has always been a good area for Red-backed Shrike and we saw two separate males here. The dry sandy soil at this site obviously suited the Balkan Thrift Armeria cariensis var rumelica. This is also a good site for Bug Orchids Anacamptis coriophora and we found a few specimens still in flower, but the Fragrant Orchids Gymnadenia conopsea agg, were mostly past their best. The Burnt Orchids Neotinea ustulata were still flowering very freely.

We stopped at another rich meadow site where conditions were much wetter and here we found some better specimens of the Lax-flowered Marsh Orchids, along with some splendid Baumann's Marsh Orchids *Dactylorbiza* baumanniana and more Fragrant and Twayblade Orchids. It was very difficult to walk in this meadow with

stepping on something of interest. From a distance it looked yellow because of the dense growth of Hay-rattle. From here it was just a short drive to our accommodation in the Hotel Dabrash for the last few days of our trip, where there were wonderful far-reaching views of the Rhodope mountains close to the Greek border. After checking in here we explored the surroundings, finding plenty of specimens of the saprophytic Violet Limodore Limodorum abortivum and the unrelated Yellow Bird's-nest Montropa hypopitys growing in profusion under the trees lining the drive. The meadows on the slopes below the hotel were incredibly rich with grassland flora and insects. The hotel had few other guests and the extensive grounds were quiet which was ideal for bird-watching and relaxing.

Day 7 Friday 23rd June

An interesting sight before breakfast was the collection of moths and other insects which had settled on the walls of the hotel below the lights. There was also a litter of wings on the steps, presumably the result of bat-predation during the night.

For our final day in Bulgaria we visited the Trigrad Gorge, a well-known location famous for its dramatic scenery and many rare plants. After a one-hour drive through lovely countryside we arrived at the start of the gorge and left the bus so that we could and walk up the road finding new plants along the way. The Prickly Whorlflower Morina persica and Martagon Lily Lilum martagon were some of the more conspicuous species but there were several more additions to our list for the week. Limestone Fern Gymnocarpium robertianum and Green Spleenwort Asplenium viride were new ferns for the list. Unfortunately, the Wallcreeper which used to frequent the gorge seems to have deserted the area so we did not linger at the usual site, but we did see some Crag Martins fly past, giving quite close views.

When we reached the bus, which was parked much further up, we drove the final short stretch to the restaurant by the river where we enjoyed a lunch of trout. After a rest here we strolled down the road checking out the flora on the verges. A small garden plot beside the road was being used to grow *Sideritis montana*, the attractive plant used to make the herbal tea we had been offered on several occasions. Our next stop was the path down to the famous "Devil's Throat" where the river plunged through a deep ravine. The path had some steep steps and a handrail and led down to a view point where we were able to see another Bulgarian endemic plant *Haberlea rhodopensis*, the only European representative of the "African Violet" family, growing on the mossy rock faces and seemingly permanently drenched in spray. It was possible to get photographs by using a telephoto lens, the plants themselves being completely inaccessible on the other side of the gorge.

By now it was time to return to the hotel for our final night, but there was still enough time for a further look at the Greater Butterfly Orchids *Platanthera chlorantha* and Limodores in the woods by the hotel. We had final gettogether in the dining going over our lists, and we also thanked Vlado and his team for looking after us so well.

Day 8 Saturday 24th June

Sadly, we had to pack up and leave early in the morning for the drive back to Sofia, so we had an early breakfast, loaded the bus and were ready to leave by 7am. The almost empty roads passed through lovely wooded hills, and we passed several large lakes and reservoirs on the way. There were glimpses of a few birds and mammals during the journey, including Roe and Red Deer, Red Squirrel, Hooded Crow, the occasional Buzzard and several White

Storks. As the scenery changed from forested uplands to agricultural land we noticed the abundance of fields of sunflowers and the rich verges with stately Mulleins lining them for mile after mile. A brief stop at a very impressive small service station broke the journey for us, giving us a chance for a final close look at some of the wayside flora, and we finally arrived at Sofia in plenty of time for our flight back to London. Some of the party were staying on in Bulgaria for a while so we said our farewells at the airport.
