Adenostyles alliariae

Adenostyles alliariae (Gouan) A.Kern., 1871

This large plant grows in groups and certainly catches the eye. Its long petiolate* basal leaves are broad, rounded and heart-shaped, with an irregularly toothed, downy and whitish border below. Those of the stem are "kissing" (they form 2 auricles that protrude from the other side of the stem). The flowers are gathered in small capitula* and form large purple-pink inflorescences.

Not to confuse

The leaves of the stem of the Alpine adenostyle (Adenostyles alpina) do not have small "ears" at the base of their petioles!
